PROVISION

After Hurricane Katrina took it's toll on the Gulf Coast the Midwest Food Bank took action to help with the clean up efforts. On September 10, 2005 a load of clean up equipment (wet/dry vacuums, generators, power washers, chainsaws, carpet cutters, shovels, etc.) was sent to Biloxi, Mississippi in response to a request from the Salvation Army. The load drove through the night to Biloxi and arrived about 8:30 am. Little did we know that at the same time a group of students from the University of Miami were driving to Biloxi ready to help with hurricane clean up. Their only concern was that they didn't have enough equipment to make a difference. The Midwest Food Bank load arrive about ½ hour after the students did. That day alone, the students worked hard to clean up 30 homes with the materials sent by the Midwest Food Bank. This event is really all about two groups of people teaming up to

In 2002, our previous facilities located at the Kieser farm on the outskirts of Bloomington seemed quite adequate for accomplishing our mission of helping to **provide food** for those in need in the Midwest by gathering and distributing large food donations free of charge to area social service organizations.
