The Honors Program at Heartland Community College offers students the opportunity to challenge themselves academically while they enhance their intellectual talents. Students with high aspirations who are highly motivated may take honors courses to help prepare them for transfer to 4-year institutions or to stand out in the job market.

Heartland's Honors Program provides a rigorous challenge in a supportive and enriched learning environment while promoting academic excellence as it recognizes outstanding performance through high academic standards. Cultural and social activities also are offered to stimulate interest in community engagement and lifelong learning.

Tuesday and Thursday 9:30 am - 12:15 pm The Paradox I: First Year Experience and ENGLISH 101.

Spring 2010: Year 1/Semester 2

Tuesday and Thursday 9:30 am - 12:15 pm The Paradox II: ENGLISH 102 and a Humanities and Fine Arts General Education course.

Fall 2010: Year 2/Semester 1

Tuesday and Thursday 9:30 am - 12:15 pm The Paradox III: COMMUNICATIONS 101 and a Social and Business Sciences General Education course.

Spring 2011: Year 2/Semester 2

Tuesday and Thursday 9:30 am - 12:15 pm The Paradox IV: Capstone and a Math and Science General Education course.



Who is Eligible?

Students who are enrolled in the Transfer Degree Programs such as Associate in Arts (AA), Associate in Science (AS), and Associate in Engineering Science (AES); and the Associate in Applied Science Degree (A.A.S) will be allowed to apply for admission.

Applicants for the Honors Program must be graduating in the top 10% of their high school graduating class; or have a recent ACT score of 25 or higher.

Meeting the minimum criteria does not guarantee admission into the Honors Program. The Honors Program office reserves the right to select the most qualified candidates. A complete, official high school transcript must be turned in with the application.



When does the Honors Program Begin?

The program is set to begin in the Fall 2009 semester.

How Do I Apply?

To apply, students must complete a Heartland Community College application, an Honors application, attach an official copy of their high school transcript, and return the completed applications/documents to the Honors Committee.
